

The Lucienne Day tea towel designs, originally launched in 1959, encapsulate the sensitive, organic and progressive talent of one of Britain's true and lasting creative spirits.

Though not undermining the functionality and everyday value, the Lucienne Day teatowel works as a stand-alone artwork, as well as a household tool.
